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Population and Households Summary


- **Usual resident** population estimated at **220,338** (the 2001 Census found 198,020 people but was later found to have underestimated the population making direct comparison difficult).
- **Most people** (96.4%) **live in households**, but **3.6% of people live in communal establishments** such as care/nursing homes or student halls of residence. This is the highest proportion in London and 23rd nationally. (compared to 95.3% living in households in 2001, 4.7% in communal establishments).
- **Overall sex ratio** in Camden is **1.04** females to each male (compared to 1.08 in 2001).
- **Population density** of Camden is **101 persons per hectare** (compared to 91 in 2001).
- The best comparison for the usual resident population is to compare the ONS mid-2001 and mid-2011 estimates. The mid-year estimates show that Camden has grown by 8.6% between 2001 and 2011 (increasing by 17,500 from 202,600 to 220,100).

Age Structure

Key Findings


- Camden's usual resident population was 220,338 with the highest proportion of 27% residents located in the 30-44 age band, higher than Greater London 25.3% and England & Wales 20.5%.
- Camden has a higher proportion of residents than Greater London and England & Wales between ages 18-44.
- England & Wales has a higher proportion of the population in the older age ranges from 60 years plus than Camden and Greater London.
- Camden's proportion of population is lower than Greater London and England & Wales between 0-17 years.
- Camden's population is closest in size to Inner London neighbouring Borough's of Westminster (219,396) and Islington (206,125).
- The percentage breakdown in Camden across the various age bands has stayed fairly similar to 2001 except in the age 18-19 band which has increased from 2.7% in 2001 to 3.3% in 2011 and 20-24 from 9.5% to 9.9%. The age band 25-29 has reduced from 13.1% to 11.8%.
- The proportions may be similar however we have seen greater demand for school places across primary and secondary ages across Camden.


Marital and Civil Partnership Status

- The **majority of people aged 16+** in Camden (55%) are **single** (never married or in a Civil Partnership). This is the 6th highest proportion in London and in England & Wales. (similar to 2001 when the proportion was 54%).
- Camden has the **6th lowest proportion of married people** (30%) in England and Wales (5th lowest in London) but...
- **4th highest proportion of people in a civil partnership** (1%) in England & Wales (3rd highest in London).
- Camden has the **12th lowest proportion of widowed** people (4%) in England & Wales and London.
- Direct comparison with 2001 is not possible as 2011 Census figures include civil partnerships while the 2001 Census did not.



Living arrangements


2011 Census: KS10 - Living arrangements of usual Camden residents aged over 16 and living in households



- 41.1% Camden residents aged over 16 live in couples and 58.9% do not.
- Of residents living in couples, just over two thirds (68.7%) are married and just under one third (31.3%) cohabiting.
- Of residents not living in couples, almost three in four (72.8%) are single.
- Camden has the eighth lowest proportion of residents living in couples of all London boroughs and the sixth highest proportion of residents who are single.
- The living arrangements of Camden residents are very similar to those found across Inner London.
- When compared with Outer London and England and Wales, a larger proportion of residents in those areas live in couples (52.9% in Outer London and 57.8% in England and Wales).
- Camden ranks in the bottom of local authorities in England and Wales for the proportion of residents who are married and living in a couple and in the top decile for the proportion of residents who are single.
- Comparison with 2001 data is not straightforward because, since 2001, since same-sex couples have become able to enter a civil partnership. These couples were counted alongside married residents in the 2011 Census.
- However, the overall proportion of Camden residents living in a couple has increased slightly, from 39.6% in 2001 (to 41.1% in 2011) and the proportion who are not has decreased from 60.4% (to 58.9%).
- The distribution of Camden residents who are not living in couple between different households within that group remains similar to that found by the 2001 Census, except for a decrease in the proportion of residents who are divorced (from 7.2 to 6.6%) and widowed (from 5% to 4%).

Household composition

2011 Census: KS105 - Composition of Camden households




- 40.6% of households in Camden are single person households, 42.5% are made up of one couple or family, and 16.9% are households of other types.
- The proportion of single person households is higher than Inner London (35.9%), Outer London (28.4%) or England and Wales (30.2%) and the fourth highest in the England and Wales. The proportion of single person households in Camden has decreased from 46.1% in 2001 to 40.6% in 2011.
- 25.6% of single person households comprise an individual aged 65 or over. This is higher than Inner London, lower than Outer London and England and Wales.
- 22% of all Camden's households contain dependent children, compared with Inner London's 22.6%, Outer London 33.9%, England & Wales 29.1%. → See *Adults not in employment and dependent children and persons*
- Camden has the eighth highest proportion of cohabiting couples without children of all local authority areas.
- Of households made up of one couple or family, 44.6% (18.9% of all households) include dependent children, slightly lower than Inner London's 48.9% or Outer London's 49.5%, but higher than 42.8%. A further 14.6% (6.2% of all households) include non-dependent children.
- 64.1% of households that include a couple who are married or in a civil partnership include children (either dependent or non-dependent), compared to 23.5% of households that include a couple who are cohabiting.
- 27.8% of households that include dependent children (including those classified as "other household types") are lone parent households. This is similar to Outer London's 25.4%, but higher than Inner London's 20.4% and England and Wales's 21.8%. The proportion of households which are lone parent households has decreased slightly, from 30.1% in 2001 to 27.8% in 2011. → See *Lone parent households with dependent children*



Households with dependent children


- 21,562 households (22.1%) are households with dependent children, an increase from 2001 (21.6%) but still lower than averages for Inner London, Greater London and England & Wales
- This is shown in the rankings for Camden - 11th in Inner London, 30th in London overall and 341st in England and Wales
- The proportion of households with dependent children aged 0-4 has also risen since 2001 from 9.9% to 10.6%, but this is also lower than London and national averages. Camden is ranked 29th in London and 208th nationally

Households where one person has a long-term health problem or disability

- 21,795 Camden households (22.3%) contain one or more persons with a long-term health problem or disability, similar to the Inner and Greater London averages.
- The majority of these households in Camden (18.3%) do not contain dependent children which though 7th highest in London is only ranked 284th in England and Wales.
- Due to recording of the long-term illness question used in 2001 data for 2011 is not comparable

Households with no adult in employment

- 28,654 households are households with no adult in employment
- Percentage of households with no adults in employment has fallen since 2001 from 34.9% to 29.4% following the trend in London and England & Wales generally
- The percentage of households with no adults in employment with dependent children is 4.7%, lower than the averages for Inner London (6%) and Greater London (5.7%) but higher than the England and Wales average (4.2%)
- Camden ranks 22nd in London for households with dependent children and no adult in employment and 91st in England and Wales
- Camden has the 7th highest percentage of households with no adult in employment and no dependent children in Greater London but compared to E&W is ranked 294th



Lone parent households with dependent children

Key Findings

- There were 6,228 lone parent households in Camden, of these 400 were male (6.4%) and 5,828 were female (93.6%).
- Lone parents not in employment accounted for 3,193 (51.3%) of the total, of these 174 were male (2.8%) and 3,019 were female (48.5%).
- Compared to other households across England & Wales shows: Lone parent households not in employment in Camden 51.3%, Inner London 50.2%, Greater London 47.8% and across England & Wales 40.6%.
- There is a large gap between female lone parent households not in employment in Camden at 48.5% when compared to England & Wales at 37.4%.
- Looking at ranks: Camden is 5th highest in England and Wales for female lone parents
- Comparing Camden lone parent households in 2001 to 2011 shows that the percentage of Male lone parents in part time employment has fallen from 11.3% to 1.3% and in full time employment from 36.9% to 2.4% whereas female lone parents in part time employment have increased from 14.8% to 25.1% and in full time employment fallen from 21.6% to 20.0%.




Comparisons and rankings

Camden has as a proportion of its population the:

- Fourth largest Bangladeshi population in London (after Tower Hamlets, Newham and Redbridge), sixth largest in England and Wales (after Oldham and Luton)
- Fifth largest White Other population in England and Wales (top 10 all in London)
- Fourth largest Chinese population in England and Wales - 6,493 people or 2.9% of the total, probably mostly students (Cambridge has largest proportion)
- Second largest mixed White/Asian population in England and Wales - small population of 3,880 or 1.8% of total but considerably larger than the Mixed White/Black Caribbean population
- Fourth largest White Irish population in England and Wales (nine of top 10 in London)

Change since 2001

Comparisons can be problematic for some ethnic groups as the categorisation has changed but there is definitely:

- A decrease in White British population from 52.7% to 44.0%, White British now a minority in the borough
- An increase in White Other population from 15.8% to 19.0%
- Surprisingly the Bangladeshi population has slightly decreased in numbers and as proportion of population – could be due to lack of affordable housing in the borough





- 36.8% of Camden's population was born abroad in 2001, increasing to 42.5% in 2011, an increase of 5.7%
- The top 5 largest increases in numbers between 2001 and 2011 were:
 1. USA - increase of 1,968 people
 2. France – 1,897
 3. China – 1,506
 4. Poland – 1,433
 5. Italy – 1,231
- Largest decreases – Republic of Ireland (-1,313), Bangladesh (-1,134)




Multiple ethnic groups

- For the first time, data on **households containing multiple ethnicities** is available.
- It covers single person households, households with different ethnicities across the generations only, households with mixed ethnicity partnerships and households with other combinations of multiple ethnic groups (e.g. shared houses)
- 25,722 households (44.3%) of more than one person contain multiple ethnicities in Camden
- This is the highest proportion in London and in England and Wales
- Camden has 11,336 households containing a mixed ethnicity partnership, 26% of households of more than one person and the third highest in the country after K&C and City of London
- This gives a real flavour of the diversity of the borough – it shows that the borough isn't just made up of discrete ethnic communities that do not mix

Year of arrival in UK




- 17.7% of the population of Camden came to the UK since the last Census in 2001
- Compared with 14.1% for London and 5.4% for England and Wales

- Compared with 7.4% for England & Wales and 22.1% for London




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Length of residence in UK








Key Findings


- Out of 97,534 households in Camden:
- 69,420 (71.2%) where all people aged 16 and over have English as a main language. 11,680 (12.0%) where at least one person aged 16 and over has English as a main language. 2,379 (2.4%) where no people aged 16 and over in a household but at least one person aged 3 to 15 has English as a main language. There were 14,055 (14.4%) households where no people have English as a main language.
- Camden compares similarly with other inner London borough's, however the England & Wales percentage of households where English is the main language is much higher than Camden at 91.2% and the percentage of households where no people have English as a main language is lower than in Camden at 4.3%.
- Ranks: Out of 348 Local Authorities Camden ranked 12th where at least one but not all people aged 16 and over in household have English as a main language and 15th where no people in the household have English as a main language.

Religion




- Christians account for 34% of the population, a reduction from 47.1% in 2001
- 12% are Muslim, 4.5% are Jewish, 1.4% Hindu, 1.3% Buddhist, 0.2% Sikh and 0.6% other religions
- The proportions of Jewish and Muslim people have fallen slightly since 2001, but Camden still ranks 5th and 25th respectively of 348 local authorities in England and Wales
- Although small, the Buddhist population is 11th largest in England and Wales
- More than a quarter of Camden's population (26%) has no religion, compared to 22% in 2001
- 20.5% did not answer the voluntary question, an increase from 10% in 2001



Day to day activities

- 31,831 Camden residents (14.4%) reported day-to-day activities being affected a little or a lot, higher than the Inner London and greater London averages but below the England and Wales trend
- Camden ranks 12th out of 14 Inner London boroughs regards the % of the population whose day-to-day activities are not limited. Camden ranks 60th in England and Wales
- New question for 2011 replacing the Yes/No question on whether people had a limiting long term illness or disability so comparison with 2001 not appropriate

General health in Camden: people whose health was... (self-rated)




General health

- The majority of people in Camden reported their general health as 'very good' (53.4%), higher than London and national averages and which placed Camden as 8th highest in London and 19th in England and Wales
- This equates to 12,349 residents reporting bad health or worse.
- Despite high proportions of very good health Camden has above London average rates of 'bad' (4.2%) or 'very bad' (1.4%) health though it mirrors the England and Wales profile
- Of people reporting their general health as 'very bad' Camden is ranked 7th highest in London and 83rd in England and Wales
- General health question changed and expanded to 5 categories so comparison with 2001 not appropriate


Unpaid care

- 17,306 residents (7.9% of the Camden's population) provide at least 1 hour of unpaid care per week. This % is similar to 2001 (7.8%)
- The proportion of the population providing 20+ hours of care per week has increased from 2.3% to 2.6%






Car and van availability

- 61% of households in Camden do not have access to a car or van. This is the 6th lowest proportion in England & Wales and in London and compares with 42% overall for London. (compared to Camden in 2001 when 55.6% of households had no access to a car/van)
- 32% of Camden households had access to a single car or van, compared to a London average of 41%. (down from 36.1% in 2001)
- 7% of Camden households had access to 2 or more cars.
- In total, it's estimated that there are 46,601 cars in Camden.


- 3.6% of people live in communal establishments
- Numbers of communal establishments in Camden is 344, lower than 2001 (497 establishments). This bucks the London and E&W trend which has seen an increase
- Camden has 2nd highest number of communal establishments in London (344) behind Westminster
- 7,895 usual residents live in communal establishments in Camden
- 84.1% of people living in communal establishments live in settings described as 'other' - this is higher than the Inner London rate (72.3% and national rate (57%)
- The rank of people in 'other' establishments is 5th in London and 14th in England and Wales
- The percentage of residents in LA care homes is 1.8%, similar to Greater London and E&W averages but lower than Inner London (1.4%)
- The percentage of Camden residents non-LA care homes (nursing or non-nursing) is 5.2% combined, considerably lower than the Inner London (16.7%) and E&W averages 36.3%

Qualifications & Students

Key Findings

- Out of 184,873 persons in Camden: 23,451 (12.7%) had no qualifications and 93,453 (50.5%) achieved a level 4 qualification or above.
- The percentage of the population in Camden with no qualification was lower in Camden when compared to Inner London (15.8%), Greater London (17.6%) and across England & Wales (22.7%).
- Camden's population had a high percentage of the population achieving a level 4 qualification or above (50.5%) when compared to Inner London (44.7%), Greater London (37.7%) and England & Wales (27.2%)
- Out of a 348 other Local Authorities Camden was ranked 5th with level 4 qualifications or above. 7th were full time students and were economically inactive and 11th were school children and full time students aged 18 and over.
- The difference between 2001 and 2011 shows that the percentage of people aged 16-74 with no qualification has fallen from 17.4% to 12.7%, and those with level 4 qualifications and above increased from 47% to 50.5%.



Economic activity 2

Men

- **Camden men have the lowest economic activity rate (73%) of any London borough**, which correlates with Camden having the highest proportion of male students in London. The Greater London average economic activity rate is 77%.
- The **employment rate** for men is 65% compared to 67.6% in London and ranks 8th lowest.
- **Camden men have smaller proportions of full-time and part-time employees** (6% and 42%) compared to Greater London (7% and 45%). Amongst London boroughs, Camden had the 10th lowest proportion of full-time employees and 14th lowest proportion of part-time employees.
- **Camden men have a slightly higher proportion of self-employed** (16.6%) compared to 16.1% for Greater London. Camden has the 16th highest proportion in London. (this up from 14.8% for Camden in 2001)
- **The unemployment rate for men is 6.8%**, compared to a London average rate of 7.5%. (The Camden rate is lower than previously recorded in 2001 when it was 8.8%).
- **39% of unemployed men were long-term unemployed and 18% had never worked.** Among London boroughs Camden ranked 9th highest on long-term unemployed, but 16th for those that had never worked.(compared to 34% and 11% respectively in 2001)


Women

- **Camden women have an economic activity rate of 63%**, 8th lowest amongst London boroughs, but which correlates with Camden having the highest proportion of female students in London. The Greater London average economic activity rate is 66%.
- The **employment rate** for women is 54.9% compared to 57.3% in London and ranks 8th lowest by London borough.
- **Camden women have the same proportion of full-time employees** as the London average (35%), **a smaller proportion of part-time employees** (10%) compared to Greater London (15%). Amongst London boroughs, Camden had the 4th lowest proportion of part-time employees.
- **Camden women have a slightly higher proportion of self-employed** (10.3%) compared to 7.3% for Greater London. Camden women have the 4th highest proportion in London. (this up from 8.4% for Camden in 2001)
- **The unemployment rate for women is 6.3%**, compared to the London average (7%). (The Camden rate for women is the same as previously recorded in 2001).
- **40% of unemployed women were long-term unemployed and 23% had never worked.** Among London boroughs Camden ranked 21st highest on long-term unemployed, but 13th for those that had never worked.(compared to 30% and 12% respectively in 2001)

Hours worked

- **All usual residents aged 16 to 74** in employment the week before the census, Camden (108,966) ranks 24th of all London boroughs for all persons in full-time and part-time employment
- **Most people (77%)** are in full time employment (a decrease from **80%** in 2001) with **23%** in part-time employment (a slight increase from **20%** in 2001)
- Of the **total male population**, only **17%** work part-time (previously **14%** in 2001) with **83%** (a three percent decrease from **86%** in 2001) in full-time employment
- **29%** of all **females** work part-time with **71%** in full-time employment (compared to **26%** of females in part-time and **74%** in full-time in 2001)

■ Full-time: 31 to 48 hours worked



- **18.2% of all usual residents aged 16 to 74 in employment the week before the census works in the professional, scientific and technical activities industry and ranks 3rd of all London boroughs and Central London boroughs, with Islington ranking 2nd (19.2%) and City of London in 1st position (26.6%)**
- The second popular industry is the **health and social work activities (10.2%) but ranks 23rd of all London boroughs**. Barking and Dagenham ranks 1st (14.1%), followed by Sutton (13.6%) and Croydon (12.9%).
- Third most popular in Camden is the **education industry at 10% and ranks 12th of all London Boroughs but 1st in Central London**.


Men

- **18.7% of all male usual residents** aged 16 to 74 in employment the week before the census works in the **professional, scientific and technical activities** industry and **ranks 3rd** of all London boroughs and **ranks 3rd** of Central London boroughs, with Islington ranking 2nd (19.6%) and City of London in 1st position (25.3%)
- The second popular industry is the **financial and insurance activities (12.7%)** but **ranks 6th** of all London boroughs. Kensington and Chelsea ranks 1st (**28.2%**), followed by City of London (**26.7%**) and Westminster (**20.9%**).
- Third most popular in Camden is the **information and communication** industry at **11.1%** and **ranks 4th** of all London Boroughs with Richmond upon Thames in 1st position with **13.8%**. Camden ranks **2nd in Central London** with Islington ranking 1st (**11.7%**).

Women

- **17.6% of all female usual residents** aged 16 to 74 in employment the week before the census works in the **professional, scientific and technical activities** industry and **ranks 4th** of all London boroughs and Central London boroughs, with Kensington & Chelsea 3rd (**17.7%**), Islington ranking 2nd (**18.7%**) and City of London in 1st position (**28.8%**)
- The second popular industry is **education (13.5%)** but **ranks 23rd** of all London boroughs. Redbridge ranks 1st (**17.9%**), followed by Enfield (**17.3%**) and Barnet (**17.0%**).
- Third most popular in Camden is the **health and social work activities** industry at **14.8%** and **ranks 24th** of all London Boroughs with Barking & Dagenham in 1st position with **23.4%**. Camden ranks **3rd in Central London** with Southwark ranking 1st (**18.7%**) and Lambeth 2nd (**16.1%**).


Socio-economic classification (NS-SeC) 1

- A higher proportion of men (22%) are in in NS-SeC group 1 compared to females (15.9%)
- The proportion of men (26%)and women (26.8%) in lower managerial, administrative and professional groups are similar
- More women (10.7%) than men (5%) work in intermediate occupations
- More men (10%) than women (5.5%)are small employers and own account workers
- More men (5%) work in lower supervisory and technical occupations than women (2.1%)
- A higher proportion of women (7.9%) work in semi-routine occupations compared to men (6%)
- A slightly higher proportion of men (5%) work in routine occupations compared to women (4.3%)
- A higher proportion of women (8.2%) have never worked compared to men (3%)
- The proportion of men (2%) who are are long term unemployed is slightly higher than the proportion of females (1.6%)
